

And we will continue our commitment to support children in care, like Ella, to achieve the best outcomes with thoughtful solutions like shared parenting.

November is National Adoption Month

National Adoption Month seeks to increase awareness of adoption issues, bring attention to the need for adoptive families for older youth in foster care, and emphasize the value of youth engagement.

Each year, awareness-raising efforts are focused on an adoption-related theme to help support professionals working each day to find permanent families for children and youth in foster care in their community. This year's National Adoption Month theme is "Conversations Matter." Promoting youth engagement can start with a simple conversation. Listen to what the young person has to say, what their goals are, and how they feel about adoption. Create an environment where they can be honest and ask questions, and feel they have a say in making decisions about their life.

Take Ella, who came into the care of foster parents Darcy and Will. Shaken and unsure coming out of an unstable

family situation, she was still yearning for the life she imagined with her birth family. "This was a connection that needed to be honored," says Will. "So, we have embraced shared parenting. We want her to maintain her identity and her history."

"We have now adopted Ella but maintain an ongoing

relationship with her birth mother," adds Darcy. "We have a shared album where we can post photos of Ella's activities and art projects, and Mom can post photos of her time with Ella."

Children's Home Society has celebrated more than 16,000 adoptions since 1902. With over 12,000 children in foster care in our state, and 450-plus aging out each year, we continue to work tirelessly in our mission to promote the right of every child to a permanent, safe, and loving family.

— CHS Implementing — New Early Childhood Development Program

Children's Home Society has been selected to be the lead implementing organization for a Guilford County-wide Community Navigation program to work with expectant parents and parents of children birth to age 3 to connect them with resources that support healthy family relationships and early child development.

A team of Community Navigators is being hired to work at obstetrician offices and other community sites to meet with and listen to families, conduct assessments to clarify family needs when appropriate, and provide connections to resources. CHS is also partnering with other organizations to coordinate delivery of Navigation across programs to support the important relationships families have with their obstetricians.

This work is being done as part of Ready for School, Ready for Life (Ready Ready). Ready Ready is working to create systems change for young children in Guilford County by helping connect services and scale effective programs to meet all the needs in the community.

The CHS HealthySteps program is also part of our early work in collaboration with Ready Ready. HealthySteps provides parent education in Guilford County pediatric practices to help parents learn strategies to promote healthy development and growth.





Much of this work is supported by the Duke Endowment, which is funding and involved in developing this innovative approach to early childhood development. This collaboration is exploring how a community-wide, coordinated effort can create lasting community-level change.

"The Community Navigation Program is just one way we are collaborating to provide innovative support to families," said Rebecca Starnes, CHS Vice President of Programs. "This program identifies what services families need, what is available and how it is accessed, and how to connect families to these services, all in an effort to keep families healthy and thriving to support early child development."

Event Brings Family and Friends Together To Sip & Support CHS

Christie Luckenbach has been a member of the Children's Home Society family from an early age when Dr. Harry and Peggy Killian adopted her as an infant through CHS. The family ties only deepened when the Killians added to their family again, adopting her brother, Matt, through CHS three years later.

A tight knit family, the Killians have been a strong foundation for each other. The Killians' extended family grew even further through CHS when CHS helped Christie and her husband Eric with the adoption of their two sons. "I was once again welcomed in as a part of the CHS family," Christie shared.

The Killians and the Luckenbachs know from their experience how a family can grow, thrive, and flourish through CHS and how they will be emotionally and practically supported along the way. The enduring love and vital foundation of

KidsCare4Kids Hosts Fundraiser at Ben & Jerry's to Support SaySo Youth

KidsCare4Kids is a nonprofit that partners with CHS's SaySo Program to provide scholarships to youth in the SaySo program. The scholarships are distributed once a year during our annual event called SaySo Saturday.

In August, KidsCare4Kids hosted a fundraiser at Ben & Jerry's where a portion of all the ice cream sales benefited the SaySo scholarship fund. In addition to the ice cream fundraiser, the group also sold raffle tickets for items such as a wine basket, gym passes, massages, and jewelry.

During set-up and over the course of the day the owner of Ben & Jerry's at Friendly Center in Greensboro dropped in "undercover" to find out what was happening, buying ice cream and raffle tickets. We didn't know until the end of the event that he was the owner.
